A total of more than \$318K of pro bono dental care was completed during this first quarter of the 2025/26 financial year. Our mission is to address the inequality between those Australians who can access the dental care they need, and those who can't.

Our vision is an Australia where no disadvantaged member of our community falls through the cracks and needlessly suffers from a lack of access to dignified professional oral health care.

Through the work that we do, we deliver better access to quality oral health care for all Australians regardless of their geographical or social situation.

From men and women who have overcome addiction, who are enduring long-term economic hardship or suffering from mental and physical health challenges; to those establishing their independence after domestic violence has stolen their freedom, and the homeless whose needless dental suffering no longer compounds their more basic struggles. We are there to provide life changing oral health treatment wherever we can help.

Through our Dental Rescue Days®, Adopt a Patient and Rebuilding Smiles® programs, our national team connects eligible individuals with specialist oral health volunteers who provide their time, expertise and practice facilities at no cost to patients.

We also fund programs that facilitate better long-term oral health outcomes through our Healthier Smiles Community Service Grants and Oral Health Education Projects and reduce the inequality of access to education through our Indigenous Study Grants.

To date, we've created change for thousands of community members by enabling the pro bono delivery of **more than \$9.6M** of professional oral health services.

We would like to thank all of our volunteer dental practices who make our programs possible as well as those companies who generously offer their financial support to our programs.

Volunteer Program Outcomes

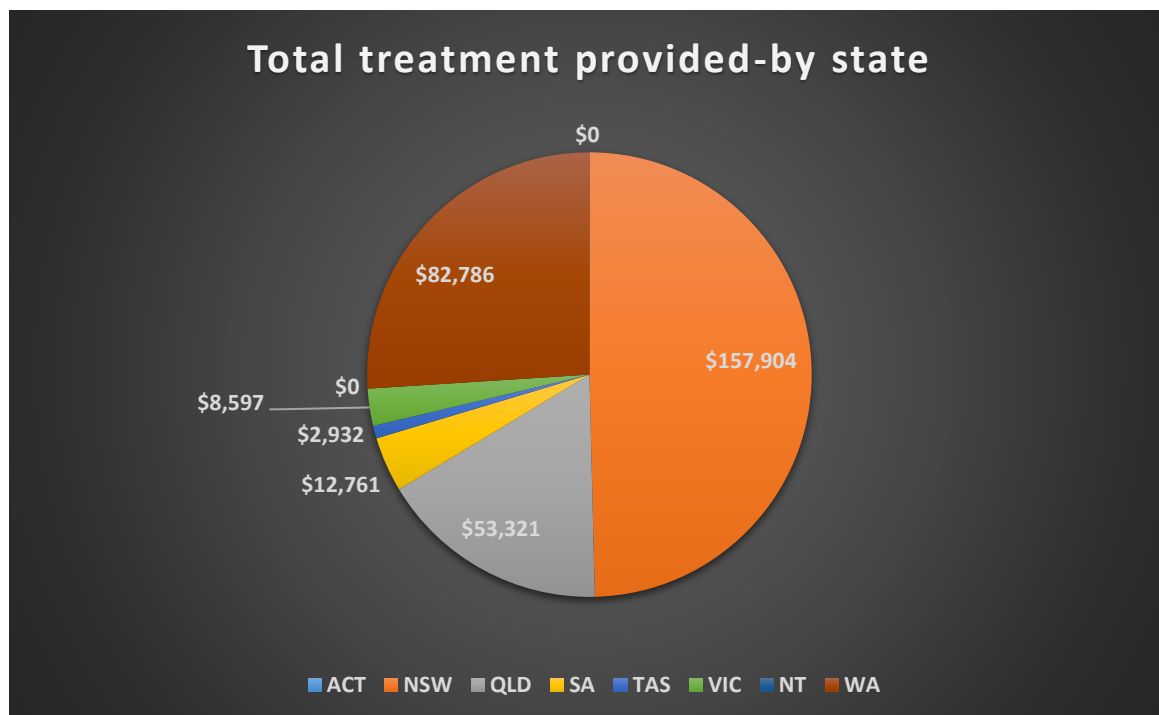
In this first quarter of financial year 2026 (July-Sep), the Foundation coordinated **11 Dental Rescue Days®** around Australia, providing **263** appointments to disadvantaged patients. The Dental Rescue Day® program coordinates access to local private practices and clinics for eligible patients, whereby a group of patients will receive a comprehensive general oral check-up in a single day as well as treatment for acute concerns.

310 appointments were attended by patients under the **Adopt a Patient** program. Under this program, an individual patient attends a local private practice or clinic to receive dental treatment and will usually require several appointments to address their often more complex oral health issues. Currently there are **90** patients being treated under the AAP program in practices throughout Australia.

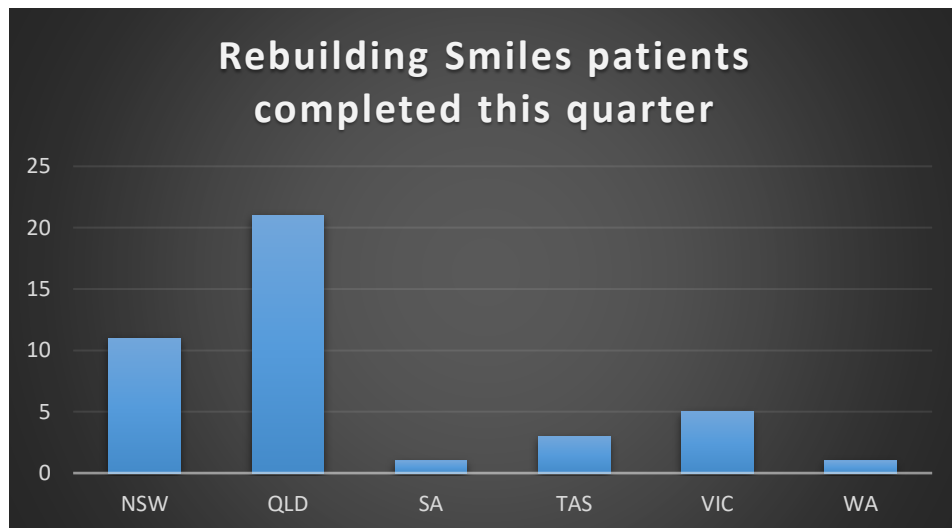
The **Rebuilding Smiles®** program focuses on providing assistance to individuals and families who have experienced family and domestic violence. During this quarter, **42** cases were completed with **87** patients currently connected to a practice or receiving treatment.

Across all three volunteer programs, pro bono treatment of **\$318,301** has been delivered by our volunteer general practitioners and specialists during the quarter.

Rebuilding Smiles completed cases



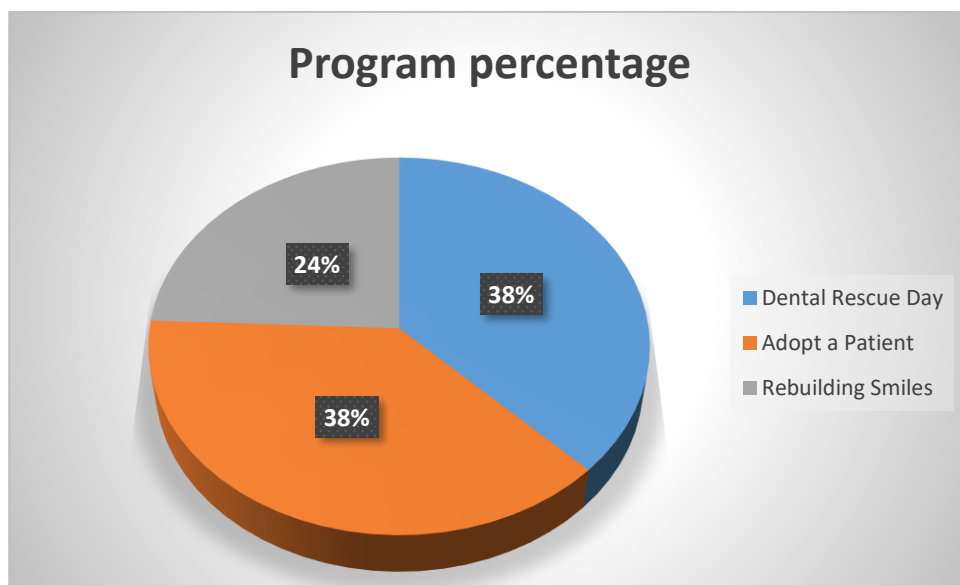

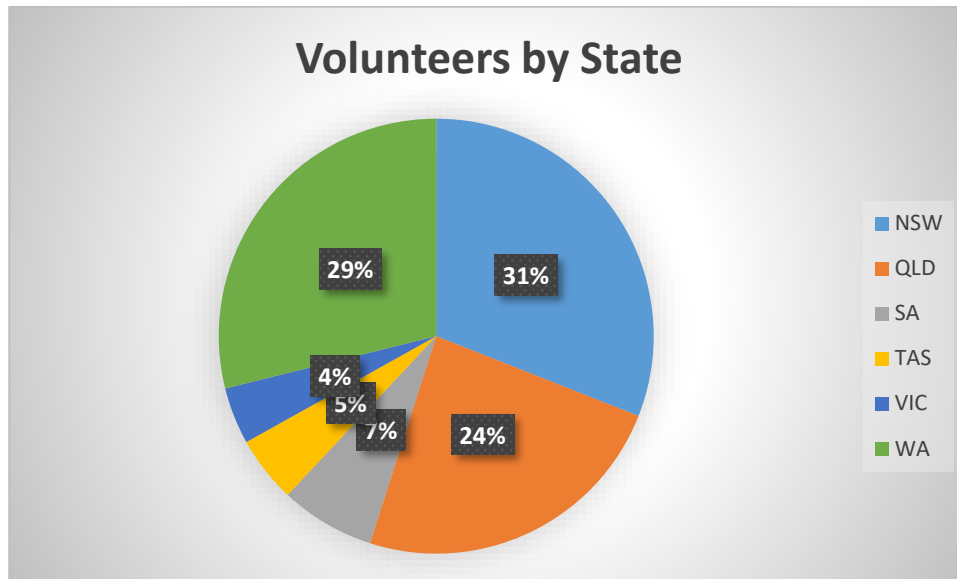

From Clinic to Community: Dr Jenny Liu's Journey of Care

In the heart of Melbourne's CBD, Happy Dentistry is known for the warmth and compassion that radiates from its team. At the helm is Dr Jenny Liu, a dedicated principal dentist whose philosophy is simple yet powerful: treat every patient with kindness, respect, and patience.

After completing her Bachelor of Dental Surgery, Dr Liu built her practice around creating a welcoming space for a diverse community including both English- and Mandarin-speaking patients. From general and cosmetic dentistry to children's dental care, Happy Dentistry offers a wide range of services, all delivered with a gentle touch and a genuine smile.

This year marked a new chapter for Dr Liu and her team as they joined the ADA Dental Health Foundation's volunteer program for the first time. "We wanted to give back to the community and make a positive

difference beyond our clinic," she shares. "Volunteering felt like a meaningful way to use our skills to help others and support those who need care the most."

For Dr Liu, the motivation to volunteer stems from a deep belief in the power of oral health to transform lives. "Every person deserves to smile confidently," she says. "Helping others in this way is incredibly fulfilling, it's a reminder of why we all chose this profession."

One particularly memorable moment came when a young couple arrived at the clinic with their baby. While one parent received treatment, the team helped care for the baby, a small gesture that made a big impact. “It was such a lovely moment of connection, not just with the patient but with the entire family,” Dr Liu recalls. “It reminded us that dentistry is about caring for people as a whole, not just their teeth.”

Volunteering has also offered valuable lessons. “It’s reinforced how important communication and empathy are in healthcare,” she reflects. “Sometimes the most meaningful care isn’t clinical, it’s emotional. Listening carefully, adapting to different needs, and creating a calm, trusting space can make all the difference.”

Dr Liu believes the biggest impact of the DHF programs is empowerment. “By improving access to dental care and education, these programs help people take charge of their oral health and overall well-being. They also foster trust in the dental profession, showing that we’re here not only to treat but to care, teach, and uplift.”

To other dental professionals considering volunteering, Dr Liu offers heartfelt encouragement: “Volunteering reconnects you with the heart of dentistry. Even a small contribution can create ripples of change, and the sense of fulfilment you gain is priceless.”

After a busy day in the clinic, Dr Liu finds balance in simple pleasures, sharing a good meal with loved ones, practicing yoga, or spending time with her two dogs, Colonel and Sanders. It’s this blend of professional dedication and personal warmth that makes her not only a skilled dentist, but a compassionate community advocate.

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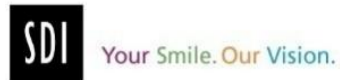
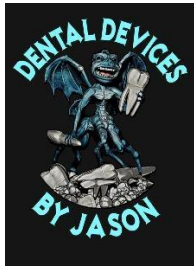


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
